

Statement of Compliance to EU Packaging Directive 94/62/EC

Fiberlab S.A. recognizes the importance of understanding its environmental responsibilities and complying with applicable laws and regulations to minimize adverse effects on human health and the environment.

Fiberlab S.A. declares, that all goods produced and exported to customers of Fiberlab S.A., when leaving factory, meets the requirements of the EC Commission Directive, relating to Packages and Packaging waste – EU Packaging Directive 94/62/EC.

As in article 3 of the EU Packaging Directive 94/62/EC, (“packaging” shall mean all products made of any materials of any nature to be used for the containment, protection, handling, delivery and presentation of goods) this should cover all types of packaging delivered directly to customers of Fiberlab S.A.

We declare concerning presence heavy metals (CR 13695-1) or toxic materials (CR 13695-2) and meeting the requirements of art. 11/3:

- Sum of concentration of lead, cadmium, mercury and hexavalent chromium shall not exceed 100 ppm (100 mg/kg) (European Parliament and Council Directive 94/62/EC of 20 December 1994 on packaging and packaging waste) (CR 13695-1);
- Packaging doesn't present toxic or hazardous chemical substances or materials (CR 13695-2).

Concerning the packaging essential requirements of Directive 94/62/EC we confirm the statement that all packaging components (plastic/cardboard spools, cardboard boxes, plastic vacuum bags, foil, etc) can be:

- Recycled concerning EN 13430;
- Energetically treated concerning EN 13431.

Environmental protection

Used packaging shall be disposed of. Cardboard, foil and polymer packaging components can be recycled. The plastic vacuum bags can be reused many times.

By confirming, we also declare that we have fulfilled our responsibilities with respect to packaging and have met all other requirements of EN 13427.
